Property developments and activities in the coastal zone are now subjected to stricter environmental legal requirements as a number of Acts regulate activities in the coastal zone:

1. National Environmental Management: Integrated Coastal Management Act 24 of 2008;
2. National Water Act 36 of 1998; and
3. National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998: Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations 2010 (GN R543 of 18 June 2010) and the Listing Notices (GN R544, GN R545 and GN R546 of 18 June 2010).

The above Acts have created new and additional EIA requirements for coastal developments and activities.

This workshop will strive to provide a practical analysis of the key environmental legal requirements applicable to development activities and land use in the coastal zone and will focus on the key legal instruments and procedures prescribed by the abovementioned legislation. The workshop will provide practical guidance to facilitate compliance and pro-actively manage such developments.

Who should attend? Coastal Municipality Officials, Provincial Government Officials, Coastal Property Developers, Land Users, and EIA Practitioners working in coastal areas.
